


## STATE HOMELAND SECURITY PROGRAM (SHSP)





## EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PERFORMANCE GRANT (EMPG)



**Purpose:** The purpose of the Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) Program is to make grants to States to assist State, local, and tribal governments in preparing for all hazards, as authorized by the *Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act* (42 U.S.C. 5121 et seq.). Title VI of the *Stafford Act* authorizes FEMA to make grants for the purpose of providing a system of emergency preparedness for the protection of life and property in the United States from hazards and to vest responsibility for emergency preparedness jointly in the Federal Government, States, and their political subdivisions. The Federal Government, through the EMPG Program, provides necessary direction, coordination, and guidance, and provides necessary assistance, as authorized in this title so that a comprehensive emergency preparedness system exists for all hazards.



## PORT SECURITY GRANT PROGRAM (PSGP)




**Purpose:** The Port Security Grant Program (PSGP) directly supports maritime transportation infrastructure security activities. PSGP is one tool in the comprehensive set of measures authorized by Congress and implemented by the Administration to strengthen the Nation's critical infrastructure against risks associated with potential terrorist attacks. The objective of this grant is to build and sustain core capabilities through activities such as: Enhance Maritime Domain Awareness; Enhancing IED and Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, Explosive (CBRNE) prevention, protection, response and supporting recovery capabilities within the maritime domain; Strengthening governance integration; Enhancing cybersecurity capabilities; and, Maritime security risk mitigation projects that support port resilience and recovery capabilities.

## METROPOLITAN MEDICAL RESPONSE SYSTEM (MMRS)




**Purpose:** The Metropolitan Medical Response System (MMRS) program supports the integration of emergency management, health, and medical systems into a coordinated response to mass casualty incidents caused by any hazard. Successful MMRS grantees reduce the consequences of a mass casualty incident during the initial period of a response by having augmented existing local operational response systems before an incident occurs.
